The Position

- 3. Works effectively with individuals, employees, business, city government, students, diverse community groups and the media to build confidence in and generate support for the schools.

The Selection Criteria, cont.

- 4. Has a record of working effectively with a school board and of keeping the Board well informed, sharing credit for accomplishments and enhancing the reputation and effectiveness of the Board.
- 5. Has demonstrated the ability to work effectively with diverse student populations, and multicultural groups within the system and the broader community.
- 6. Speaks and writes effectively to communicate the successes as well as the needs of the school system.
- 7. Seeks information and ideas relative to the problem, makes decisions that show fairness, mature judgment, appropriate analysis and sensitivity for those affected by the decisions.
- 8. One who has experience in working with a community, staff and students in developing long-range goals for the schools system and a determination to accomplish those goals.
- 9. Experience as a teacher and administrator who understands the day-to-day operations of the classroom, has sound knowledge of instruction, curriculum and educational programs for elementary schools.
